**Committee/Council Reports:**

**Communications from the Town Manager:**

1. Tena Woenker reported that the I-69 Force Main project was on track and should still be completed by early August 2017.
2. August 24, 2017 is the one-year celebration for the reopening of the Train Depot. Tena explained there would be music, refreshments and have knowledgeable staff on hand to answer questions and to relate the history of the train station in Waterloo.
3. Tena was pleased to announce the maps Wessler Engineering had taken to update is almost complete and that it is now GIS compatible.
4. Tena informed the committee that the July council meeting will mark the 2<sup>nd</sup> ordinance for the annexation and after that will start the ninety-day remonstrance.
5. Main street is planning movie night at the library on July 14<sup>th</sup> at the library.
6. Tena also reported that volunteers were needed August 24<sup>th</sup> for the Old 27car club luncheon.

**New Business:**


1. The council approved the May minutes and claims

5. Chris LaLonde received three bids for a new sewer truck. Council approved a sewer truck from Ben Davis and a crane from H&H Sales Company
6. A new lift station was also approved at 240 Chestnut Street
7. Superintendent Chris LaLonde received a quote for two roofs put on at the sewer plant. Council approved.


**Other Business:**
